The Water Dialogue and the Los Angeles County Flood Control District will sponsor a “Town Hall” meeting for DWR and the SWRCB to receive input concerning the Proposition 50 Integrated Regional Water Management Plan (IRWMP) Grant Program. The meeting will be on Wednesday, September 27, 2006 from 12 noon until 3 p.m. at MWD headquarters, 700 N. Alameda St. in downtown Los Angeles.

The purpose of the informal meeting is to give agencies, organizations, and other interested parties an opportunity to provide input concerning the administration of the Prop 50 IRWMP Program. These comments will be considered by DWR and SWRCB during their mid-point review of the IRWMP process. DWR/SWRCB will conduct formal meetings in early 2007 to receive feedback from applicants on potential revisions to guidelines and the PSP. Representatives from DWR and SWRCB will be in attendance to make a presentation on the IRWMP Prop 50 Grant Program and take comments from interested parties.
